Thank you for referring your patient XXXXXXXX. The results of the exam are as follows:

**EXAM TYPE: MRI of the Left Forefoot Without Contrast.**

**HISTORY:** Trauma three weeks ago. The patient dropped the cane on foot.

**COMPARISON:** None.

**TECHNIQUE:** Multi-sequence/multiplanar MRI of the left forefoot was obtained without intravenous contrast.

**FINDINGS:** There is a nondisplaced fracture of the third metatarsal diaphysis with intense underlying bone marrow edema and evidence of callus formation along the dorsal medial aspect of the diaphysis. There is no evidence of a displaced fracture. Periostitis is noted and there is reactive myositis about the third metatarsal. No other areas of marrow signal abnormalities are seen. There is no Lisfranc fracture or dislocation. The metatarsophalangeal joints are congruent.

There is no acute or inflammatory type of arthritis.

There is mild first metatarsophalangeal and sesamoid-metatarsal joint osteoarthritis.

The transverse ligament is intact and FHL does not demonstrate subluxation or dislocation. The flexor and extensor tendons are normal in course, configuration, and signal intensity. There is no subluxation, tenosynovitis, or full or partial thickness tear. Nonspecific dorsal subcutaneous edema and swelling is present likely posttraumatic.

The plantar plates are intact. There is no evidence of plantar plate rupture or distal plantar fascial rupture.

There is no evidence of muscle atrophy.

No osseous or soft tissue masses are seen.
